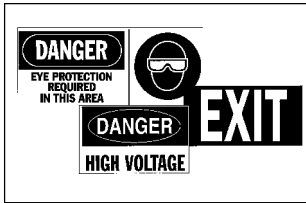

Overview

Regulatory Citation

29 CFR 1910.145, Specifications for Accident Prevention Signs and Tags

Related regulations:

What It Is

An OSHA regulation that establishes rules regarding the design, application, and use of safety signs or symbols and tags in the workplace to indicate hazardous conditions and prevent accidents.

Who It Applies To

All employers in any industry where hazard warnings are necessary.

Exemptions

This standard does not cover safety signs designed for:

- Streets,
- Highways,
- Railroads, and
- Marine regulations.

In addition, these specifications do not apply to:

- News releases,
- Bulletins used for employee education,
- Plant bulletin boards, or
- Safety posters.

The regulation's tag specifications do not apply to construction, agriculture, or maritime industries.
